

Friends of Union County Library and Our Bakeless Bake Sale

Because Union County Public Library is closed, all our library-based meetings and events are cancelled until further notice. We hope some events can be rescheduled when our library reopens; but, in the meantime, Friends of Union County Library (FOUCL) wants to continue to advocate for libraries, literacy, and lifelong learning.

FOUCL is asking for donations to our first ever Bakeless Bake Sale. This replaces our usual May Mother's Day bake sale. Money raised from this sale will be given to Union County Public Library staff in celebration of National Library Workers Week. No baking or buying of baked goods is involved. Think about what you would have spent to bake or to buy – and, perhaps, add a little bit more. Cash or checks (made out to FOUCL, or Friends of Union County Library) should include a note that they are for BBS (Bakeless Bake Sale). Deadline for donations is Friday, May 15.
