



I am glad to be able to say we are up and running full speed, after the past couple of years. I'd like to share a few things that are going on.

We have started working on Summer Reading Program events and activities for the summer. Each year FOUCL donates \$1000 toward our Summer Reading Program. The theme this year will be "An Ocean of Possibilities".

We will be doing a special Dr. Seuss birthday celebration on February 28, 2022 at 11:00 AM for our youngest patrons. We are so grateful to FOUCL for providing a Dr. Seuss book to each family that attends the program.

For our elementary age children, Lego Club started back up last November 16th and will be meeting the 3rd Tuesday of each month during the school year. Our first Junior Book Club was January 27th and will be the 4th Thursday of each month. The kids at the first book club discussed Cam Jansen books by David A. Adler. Mrs. Ann also had some great games and activities planned. Each month there will be a different author or book series, so make sure you watch for information about it.






Harvey showed off the finished ornament he made.



More About...

FOUCL's Website Foucl.org



At each quarterly meeting, Robert Harford gives an update on the usage of our website. The graph presents a lot of pretty colored lines. As we try to decode the meaning of each column, we have identified some very good trends.

- ◆ Unique Visitors. The orange bar represents how many people are using our website.
- ◆ Visits: The yellow bar tells us how many times people log on to the website.
- ◆ Pages: The dark blue bar shows how many different pages the visitor is looking at.
- ◆ Hits: The light blue bar indicates how many different things visitors are exploring.

From this graph we know the website is being used more every day, and people are finding things that interest them on it. We see growth in every area,

From January to December, the number of people logging on to check information has increased a lot (orange and yellow bars) and our visitors are looking at more things (dark blue and light blue bars).
