What a busy quarter UCPL has had! In April we hosted our first annual LIBCON. The event drew 105 people who enjoyed dressing up, snacking on Japanese treats, creating fan art, and meeting an artist who has

In June, we kicked off the Summer Reading Program with a registration day that included popsicles provided by our Friends of the Library, snacks, visitors from the Blue Ridge Mountain EMC and Georgia Forestry, crafts, and, of course, registration for SRP! 273 children, 89 adults, and 25 teens, for a total of 362 patrons registered! Popular programs included Crescent Circus, Birds of Prey with Georgia Mountain Falconry, and Wildlife Wonders Zoo.

Highlights

We were invited to join UCEM for their annual "Brag Night." Morgan and I had such a wonderful time promoting the Summer Reading Program and all the other great things that we do. Another invitation we received was to participate in the UCEM 4th-grade field trip to Meeks Park, where they met community helpers. We helped around 250 children create chalk art and told them about things we do at the library!

Our Friends of the Library and Master Gardeners have collaborated to create a beautiful pollinator garden in the median outside the library. It included all of the plants needed to register as part of the Rosalynn Carter Butterfly Trail Garden.





All totaled, we hosted 42 programs, with a total of 2,372 attendees. An interesting statistic for fun is that we have circulated between 500 and 620 books each Monday over the last month.
