



Bake Sale November 13

The Friends of Union County Library (FOUCL) have been holding November Bake Sales, right before Thanksgiving, for many years. This year is slightly different. We are holding a bake sale on Thursday, November 13, in conjunction with the first day of Union County Public Library's 3-day book sale (where you can buy a bag of books for \$5). Our library is located at 303 Hunt Martin Street in Blairsville.

Bring some homemade bakery for us to sell (we are accepting bakery beginning on Wednesday, November 12, from 3 to 5 PM or Thursday, November 13, before 10 AM) or come in and buy. We will be selling individually wrapped bakery and snacks in the parking lot early (while you may be standing in line for the book sale), and we will be in the library for the full bake sale from 10 AM to 2 PM (or until all is sold) selling cakes, pies, cookies, breads, and other treats. There will even be some gluten free items.

Most items will freeze easily, if you wish to save them for Thanksgiving Day, but all will likely be so tempting that you may want to eat them as soon as you get home. Or maybe they won't last that long. No judging. Once purchased, you may consume whenever you wish.

Worried about how to juggle your book purchases and your bake sale shopping? FOUCL will provide a book nook to corral your book bag until you have finished your bakery shopping. Fill out a FOUCL-provided tag with your name, get it affixed to your bag of books, and you will be ready to continue shopping unencumbered. We can even help you get everything to your car when you are finished. Just ask.
